The traditions of fairs in the New World began with the York Fair, America's first fair, held in the historic old Town of York in 1765, eleven years before the nation was founded. A charter to hold that fair was granted to the people of York by Thomas Penn, son of William Penn.

At that time, the York Fair existed as a two-day agricultural market on the town commons, now known as Penn Park. Records don't tell us too much about the York Fair during the American Revolution or the War of 1812, but we know the troops passing through York camped in the commons, so they would have shared the grounds with the Fair.

In 1853 a group of prominent York County agricultural leaders formed the York County Agricultural Society for the purpose of making the fair a three-day event and finding it a new home. That society purchased seven acres and established a new fairground in 1856. The new location was on what was then the east side of the City of York near what is now Queen Street and King Street.

In 1861, within days of the firing on Fort Sumter, injured Union soldiers were placed in temporary hospitals set up in the old Penn Commons and in the new fairgrounds. In 1862 the Secretary of War made those hospitals permanent so by fair time that year, the halls and grounds were filled with wounded from Antietam and the fair was closed until 1865.

Following the Civil War, the York County Agricultural Society, in 1888, decided the fair had once again outgrown its grounds and these early fair leaders purchased land and moved the event to the 73-acre site that was eventually expanded to become the current York Fair/York Expo Center property.

The fair remained open after the outbreak of World War I, but was not held in 1918 due to an influenza outbreak that killed 166 people in York.

Over the decades the Fair has changed in many ways in order to keep attracting people. As tastes in entertainment evolved, the fair added horse races, dancers, strong man competitions and all kinds of new things to look at and enjoy.

In 1926 a new Grandstand was constructed and the fair it became a five-day event, opening on Tuesdays and closing on Saturdays. The daytime nature of the fair passed into history two years later in 1928 when the York Fair stayed open in the evenings on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Tuesday night was added in 1931 and a year later the fair remained open on Saturday evenings.


During the '30s the midways became lines with so-called "freak shows" and automobile racing became popular on the track.

During World War II most fairs and the Pennsylvania Farm Show closed, but the York Fair, whose president at that time was Samuel Lewis, stayed open, causing plenty of controversy. In 1942 the fair dates were changed so that the event moved from October to September where it is celebrated to this day.

The Fair constructed its first all-weather year-round exhibition building, Memorial Hall, in the 1950s and began renting that facility to outside promoters for non-fair events throughout the year.

The York Fair remained open throughout the long war in Vietnam and in 1975 it was expanded to become a nine-day event including two Saturdays and a Sunday.

Older fair buildings including Horticulture Hall, Old Main and the Banquet Center that includes the Pennsylvania Room and White Rose Room were rehabilitated, weatherized and air conditioned and then rented year round just like Memorial Hall. Memorial Hall was then expanded, more than doubled, in 1995 with the addition of a second clear-span exhibit room and a spacious lobby, rest rooms and ticket offices.



Then in 1997 the fair itself expanded to become a tenday fair that includes two full weekends. It now opens on the first Friday after Labor Day and closes on Sunday of the second weekend.

The York Fair was underway during the tragic events of September 11th, 2001, when terrorists attacked the World Trade Center in New York and the Pentagon. The fair remained open in the days following the terrorist attack, since the Board of Directors felt the fair was a showcase and celebration of American culture that had been attacked without cause.

Today, the property purchased by the Society back in 1888 serves the community all year long. More than 160 events are booked into the fair's buildings and grounds every year. These popular happenings include Street Rod conventions, train shows, motorcycle events and many kinds of trade shows and spectator events.

To expand that success, the York County Agricultural Society constructed its new Toyota Arena in 2003, creating 114,000 square feet of rent-able year-round exhibit space for the York Expo Center and a new home for all the livestock events during future celebrations of America's First Fair. In its first year of operation, the Toyota Arena hosted the Grand Ole Opry, graduations, conventions, car shows, trade shows and a major political rally for President George W. Bush.

Alice Cooper's 2009 "Theatre Of Death" Tour Is Coming !!! By Michael Davis & Lisa Young

Alice Cooper has announced that in late September he will hit the U.S. with his 2009 "Theatre Of Death" tour and has four dates lined up in PA & NJ!

On 9/17/09 at the York Fair in York, PA, on 9/18/09 at the Warner Theatre in Erie, PA, on 9/22/09 at the Scranton Cultural Center in Scranton, PA and on 9/25/09 at the House Of Blues in Atlantic City, NJ!!!

The 2009 tour is in support of his latest album, "Along Came A Spider". Without Alice Cooper, there might never have been the NY Dolls, KISS, Marilyn Manson, Nine Inch Nails, Motley Crue, Slipknot or Rob Zombie! Maybe not even David Bowie, or at least not Ziggy Stardust. The iconic hard rocker, who literally invented the concept of the rock concert as theater or "Shock Rock", has returned to what he does best on his 2008 release of, "Along Came a Spider", the 25th studio album of a long and illustrious career which began in 1969 with the release of "Pretties for You" on Frank Zappa's, Straight label.

From his first solo album, "Welcome to My Nightmare" in 1975 through releases such as, "The Last Temptation" in 1994 and "Brutal Planet" in 2000, concept albums have been a specialty of Alice's, and this time he spins the story of a serial killer who imagines himself as the most predatory of all insects, trapping his prey, killing them, then enveloping his eight victims in silk, taking a leg from each of them. A web of intrigue, wrapped around some serious hard rock!

Songs like the opening, "I Know Where You Live" and "Vengeance Is Mine" featuring a snaking metal guitar solo from guitar icon, Slash, evoke such classic Alice anthems as, "Is it My Body," and "Under My Wheels", along with landmark albums like "Love It To Death", "Killer", "Billion Dollar Babies", "School's Out" and "Dragontown". There's also a patented rock ballad in the tradition of "Only Women Bleed" and "I Never Cry" with "Killed by Love."

"Along Came A Spider" features Cooper's touring band of drummer Eric Singer, bassist Chuck Garric and guitarists Keri Kelli and Jason Hook. Songwriting was handled by Alice with Saber, Hampton, Garric, Kelli and a few friends including former band member Damon Johnson and Warrant's Jani Lane.

Finally, though, it is beauty that defeats the beast, as the Spider falls in love with one of his intended victims in "The One That Got Away" and "Killed by Love," before a surprise twist ending worthy of the TV show, "The Twilight Zone".

The seeds for Slash's emblematic guitar solo on, "Vengeance is Mine", were planted when Alice and Slash shared a dressing room at a NARAS event in L.A. earlier this year. Old friends who have known each other since 1986 and 1987 when a young Guns 'N Roses opened for Alice, and have appeared on each other's albums occasionally, the subject of the new album came up.

"I told him to play what he wanted to," says Alice. "And he came in and just blew it away. I had total confidence he would nail it. I wanted him to do what he does. And he did. It was a guitar hero moment."

Speaking of a guitar hero, Alice acknowledges that the game of the same name has introduced a whole new generation to his music. "Every nine-year-old I run into tells me, 'I can play, "School's Out" and "No More Mr. Nice Guy".

With a schedule that includes six months of every year on the road, Alice Cooper is bringing his own brand of rock psycho-drama to fans both old and new, and enjoying it as much as the audience does.

Known as the architect of "Shock Rock", Alice (in both the original Alice Cooper band and as a solo artist) has rattled the cages and undermined the authority of generations of guardians of the status quo, continuing to surprise fans and exude danger at every turn, like a great horror movie, even in an era where CNN can present real life shocking images.

With the Stones-like swagger of songs like "Catch Me If You Can" and "I'm Hungry,"
Alice plumbs his roots in twisted garage-band Rock & Roll.



As he heads back out on the concert trail again this year now that "Along Came a Spider" has been unleashed, Alice insists he's still motivated to continue touring and making albums, as well as making time for such side projects as, Cooper'stown (his Phoenix-based restaurant/sports bar), his, Alice Cooper: Golf Monster book, and his Nights With Alice Cooper nightly radio show, syndicated domestically and worldwide on over 100 stations.

"If there's nothing standing in my way, why not? It's what I love doing. And no one puts on a show as good as ours, musically and visually. I'm glad to be an elder statesman, and a healthy one. I look to guys like Ozzy, Iggy and Steven Tyler as fellow survivors. We're carnivores, not dinosaurs. We eat whatever bands are in our path."

With his influence on Rock & Roll long since acknowledged, there is little that Alice Cooper hasn't achieved in his remarkable career, including platinum albums, sold-out tours, best-selling-books, his restaurant and any number of honors and career achievement awards!





Robbie's style of playing, his techniques, effects and arrangements gave the band an unmistakable and intense sound.

The intensity of the trio was ultimately matched and solidified by the addition of drummer, Brian Kilian, a longtime Philly musician who had been playing with various acts in Nashville since the early part of the decade.

When the four got together to test out this new sound, the result was undeniable! An aggressive mix of lyrics and music that fits perfectly into the modern rock genre. The name, Automatic Fire, comes from that sense of aggression. It's meant to imply something strong, forceful and perhaps a bit out of control.

Godsmack, Theory of a Deadman, Drowning Pool and Charm City Devils accompanied the legendary rock band on their second annual excursion, which got underway on 7/19/09 in Camden, NJ at the Susquehanna Bank Center! The 30-city trek has crisscrossed the U.S. twice and will finish up with a final performance scheduled for 9/5/09 at the Performing Arts Center in Darien Lake, NY.

In Memory of Rock Legend

Les Paul - Rock & Roll Pioneer Passes Away !!! By Michael Davis & Lisa Young

Friends, fans, musicians and the entertainment industry in general are mourning the loss of Les Paul, who died on Thursday (August 13th) at the age of 94. Paul died of complications from severe pneumonia at White Plains Hospital in White Plains, New York.

The legendary musician is perhaps best known for his pioneering efforts in the creation of the solid-body electric guitar. His template for the Les Paul model, which was introduced in 1952, is Gibson's best-selling electric.

In addition to creating signature guitar sounds, Paul invented many recording techniques, including overdubbing, delay effects such as tape delay, phasing effects, and multi-track recording.

Paul and his former wife, Mary Ford, had a string of hits during the 1950s while signed to Capitol Records, including "How High The Moon", "Bye Bye Blues", "The World Is Waiting For The Sunrise", and "Vaya Con Dios." Paul and Ford were inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame in 1977. In 1988, Paul was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.


On the occasion of his 90th birthday in 2005, a collaborative album, called Les Paul & Friends: American Made World Played was released. The project featured pairings with Paul and other electric guitar greats, including Keith Richards, Buddy Guy, Billy Gibbons, Jeff Beck, Eric Clapton, and Joe Perry. Paul won two Grammy Awards for tracks on the album, for Best Pop Instrumental Performance and Best Rock Instrumental Performance.


At the time that American Made World Played was released, Paul told us that he could hear his influence in the guitar playing of the younger generations, but he was just as proud that they moved forward with whatever they learned from him: "They've taken the, the licks and the ideas and applied 'em differently, so it's very amusing, or very interesting, to me to see how they've changed it and made it work, made it so new and different. It's always a pleasure to hear someone creating something new."

The following statements were issued after news of Paul's death:

Joe Satriani -- "Les Paul set a standard for musicianship and innovation that remains unsurpassed. He was the original guitar hero, and the kindest of souls. Last October I joined him onstage at The Iridium club in NYC, and he was still shredding. He was and still is an inspiration to us all."

Joe Perry -- "As a guitarist and a fan of music in general, I know the amazing contributions Les Paul made in his lifetime to the art of making music. I think if the general public knew how much of that influence is heard every day in the music that they listen to, they would be amazed. He was a true genius. The few times that I had met him, he made me feel like I had known him forever. He was always sharp, ready to rock and he was always talking about his next gig. Knowing that he is not walking the earth anymore is sad and I have lost a friend. But every time I pick up a guitar I'll know that his spirit is alive and well right next to me."





Keith Urban -- "I have a mix of emotions today. On one hand, I am deeply saddened at Les Paul's passing, and on the other a feeling of incredible gratitude and awe for his unquantifiable contribution to the world of music. His name adorns so many of the creations that I communicate through every night out here on the road...He is also very present every time I set foot in the studio and am able to lay multiple tracks as I record, when I use echo, etc., the list of his inventions, in addition to his famous signature model Gibson, are extraordinary. I also feel that even in his nineties, the fact he was still playing every Monday night in New York is perhaps the most beautiful and inspiring achievement of all. As Vince Gill would say, "Go rest high on that mountain Les...cause son, your work on earth is done."

Jimmy Buffett -- Buffett paid tribute to Paul during "A Pirate Looks at 40" performed Thursday night at the DTE Energy Music Theatre in suburban Detroit. Buffett added footage of Paul performing to his video montage during the song and said "Thank you, Les Paul!" just before starting the song's final verse.

As a guitarist, composer, electronic innovator and inventor, he was beyond genius and there was none other like him. He was a true musical gift from God to the world and spent his life honoring that gift. I proudly play my Les Paul guitars every night on stage and never forget the moments we shared."

Neil Portnow (President/CEO of The Recording Academy) -- "Three-time GRAMMY winner Les Paul was a musical mastermind whose innovations in electric guitar and recorded music are unparalleled. A 1983 Trustees Award recipient and a 2001 Technical GRAMMY Award recipient, his career and contributions to popular music will forever be celebrated, and will continue to influence future generations of musicians. His magnetic charm and sunny disposition matched his incredible skill set, and he will always be remembered with great fondness, humility, and respect. The music industry has lost a true innovator and legend."

Terry Stewart (President and CEO of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum)

-- "Without Les Paul, we would not have rock and roll as we know it. His inventions created
the infrastructure for the music and his playing style will ripple through generations. He was truly
an architect of rock and roll."



Rick Springfield Still Rocking At 60 !!! By Michael Davis & Lisa Young

Rick Springfield is a songwriter, musician and actor who has now been in the entertainment business since 1968 and turns 60 years old this year and will be playing at the Borgata Casino in Atlantic City, NJ on 9/25/09!

Rick is an Australian-American. Yup, he is an "Aussie". He spent his childhood on various army bases in Australia and Britain. As a teenager, he fronted many music bands-such as the "Jordy Boys", "Wakedy Wak" and "Zoot". The latter was his most successful paving his way for his future success as a musician.

However, that success was still a long time coming. While he waited for that big break he signed a contract with Universal television which cast him in bit parts in 1970s shows such as the "The Six Million Dollar Man" and "The Rockford Files". He also had a recurring role on the soap opera, "The Young and the Restless". In the early 1980s, his luck changed as he signed to RCA Records and was then cast as, Dr. Noah Drake, on the soap opera, "General Hospital".

While he had released six albums in the 1970s, as a musician, he is most famous for his 1981 album, "Working Class Dog". Most notable on this album were the singles "Jessie's Girl", which went to #1 on the Billboard charts, and "I've Done Everything for You" which was written by Sammy Hagar, and reached #8 on Billboard. Springfield won a Grammy in 1982 for "Best Male Rock Vocal Performance" for "Jessie's Girl".

Springfield was also nominated for a second Grammy in 1982 and a third Grammy in 1983. His following release in 1982, the album "Success Hasn't Spoiled Me Yet", also contained a string of top 40 hits including the hit, "Don't Talk to Strangers" and the ballad "What Kind of Fool Am I? He has 16 albums to his credit and multiple songs that still enjoy airplay!


His 1983 album, "Living in Oz" contained more serious subject matter, and more of a hard-rock sound. The album went platinum on the strength of the hits, "Human Touch", "Souls", and "Affair of the Heart". That same year he won an American Music Award for "Favorite Pop/Rock Male Artist" along with John Cougar Mellencamp.

His 1984 single, "Love Somebody" (from the soundtrack album to the "Hard to Hold" movie he starred in that year) reached #5 on the Billboard singles chart. He stopped touring in 1985, for the birth of his first son, Liam. Also in 1984, Mercury Records released, "Beautiful Feelings", which were unreleased sessions Springfield recorded in 1978. The album reached # 78 on the LP charts, and a single, "Bruce", a song about people mistaking Springfield for Bruce Springsteen, hit #27 on the Hot 100.

Springfield was one of several performers who participated in the 1985 Live Aid charity concert. After releasing the album, "Tao" in 1985, Springfield chose to take a break from recording to spend more time with his family.

In 1987, Springfield returned to the studio and released the album, "Rock of Life". The next year, he was seriously injured in an ATV accident. Since he was unable to play the guitar for six months, the planned tour to promote his album was canceled. It would be nearly a decade before Springfield would return to the studio to record the albums, "Sahara Snow"





From 1999 onward, he has held several concert tours throughout North America. In February 2004, he released the critically acclaimed album, "Shock/Denial/Anger/Acceptance" on his own "Gomer Record" label. It went up to #8 on the Top Independent Albums chart, and #22 on Top Internet Album Sales chart.


On April 28, 2006, Springfield performed a medley of his hits at the 33rd Daytime Emmy Awards, and received an enthusiastic response, which included a standing ovation from his acting peers. Springfield's latest release is a live concert DVD entitled, "Live in Rockford".


In late August 2007, Springfield took part in the "Countdown Spectacular 2" concert series in Australia. It was the first time he had performed live in Australia for thirty five years.

In August 2008, he released, "Venus in Overdrive" which debuted on Billboard at #28. He also performed the first single "What's Victoria's Secret" on "General Hospital" as Eli Love.

As an actor, Springfield's best known role is that of the character, Dr. Noah Drake on the daytime drama, "General Hospital". He originated the character from 1981-1983 and then returned to play him again in 2005. He then appeared on the TV show, "Don't Forget The Lyrics", in January 2009 to sing "Jessie's Girl" and his new song, "What's Victoria's Secret".

With over 17 Top 40 Hits and over 20 million records sold and counting, not to mention his acting career, Rick's list of accomplishments is very long and impressive and he shows no signs of slowing down or stopping anytime soon!
