Alice Cooper's "Theatre Of Death" Rocked The House Of Blues !!!

Alice Cooper brought his 2009 "Theatre Of Death" tour to the House Of Blues in Atlantic City, NJ on 9/25/09!

He is executed twice within the first 30 minutes of his Theatre of Death show. The first execution is by guillotine; just one of the gory props that got Cooper branded a shock rocker back in the early 1970s.

He gets knocked off again during the show when he's strung up and hanged, and then spiked to death. Yup, Alice gets injected with a lethal dose of poison and sings, "Poison", the song which furthered his career in 1989, through a giant syringe by a hot looking nurse.

Cooper's daughter Calico is a tour fixture, playing the haughty nurse Rozetta (who performs a strip-tease behind a backlit hospital screen) to Alice's white-gowned inmate for the plaintive. At one point in the show she wheels Cooper out in a wheel chair, settles him on stage and proceeds to rip off her overcoat and starts angle-grinding her crotch, sending sparks flying.

Then she strips, ever so tastefully behind a white screen, but she doesn't last long as Cooper throttles her before holding her in his arms to sing his 1975 hit, "Only Women Bleed".

Alice played all his hits like: "School's Out, "Department Of Youth", I'm Eighteen", Welcome To My Nightmare", "Poison", "Only Women Bleed", "No More Mr. Nice Guy" as well as, new songs off his latest album, "Along Came A Spider, released in 2008, just to name a few! His catalog of hits is very long and he covered more of them than we could count!

Aged 61, Cooper's voice is strong and with great tone - a refreshing commodity in the hard rock genre - and his theatrical stylings ensnare his crowd in a macabre storyline amounting to a jagged, maniacal rock opera.

His band provides consummate back-up on a grand, tiered stage and those blackedout eyes and bright white teeth defy the tongue-in-cheek approach (Vince) Furnier takes to delivering the evolution of his alter-ego from mental institution to prince of darkness.

The theatrics came thick and fast as Cooper speared a hooded nemesis before retribution was delivered in the form of a straightjacket from his 1978 concept album, "From The Inside".

This was the album that tipped his consciousness on heavy drinking after a stay in a New York sanitarium, suffering prolonged alcohol abuse.

The theme continued with, "Go To Hell" where he contemplates his own beheading as he picks his wax likeness from the guillotine's basket and the tortuous Guilty was massaged into a slamming showcase of light and sound under the command of his metal-minded rhythm section.

He trashed his microphone stand and strobe lights and smoke affected a lightning storm as "Welcome To My Nightmare" and its tough, consistent vocals garnered rapturous reverie from the sold-out crowd.

"I Never Cry" saw Alice taken to the gallows and with noose in place, the floor dropped, his neck snapped and he was wheeled out swinging.


He came back as a black leather spider and the sinister overtones cut even deeper for "Vengeance Is Mine", which had its guitar solo written by Alice's buddy, Slash (of Guns 'N Roses & Velvet Revolver). He prowled the stage, staring down the crowd to portray the brooding madman who created the embodiment of the word 'sinister' decades before Heath Ledger's posthumous accolade as, "The Joker".

Then came Alice wielding menacing staffs for Devil's Food, Dirty Diamonds (with jewels thrown to the crowd) and a sword sheathed in "Alice Cooper" cash (\$100 bills no less!) which was splashed to the front rows during Billion Dollar Babies. But the mutants got the better of him and turned him into a cleverly dangerous boxed kebab.

He fought back with a heckles-up version of "No More Mr Nice Guy" and the hits juts

kept coming!





His encore commanded a standing ovation with his old, white top hat and tails morphing into a silver sequined version. He brandished his cane and strutted the stage like Cab Calloway on the full length, 'School's Out".

He may spend his days playing golf, but Alice proves old rockers never die, despite the efforts of his best mutants who also happen to be the happiest roadies bumping in one of modern music's most timeless and consistent showmen.

Back for the encore in top hat and tails, Cooper led the band through a second rendition of "School's Out," popping giant confetti-filled balloons with a sword.

It's a nightmare being Alice Cooper - and he revels in it. Of course the nightmare is prolonged by the fact Alice is immortal. They keep killing him and he keeps coming back! Until they finally kill Alice, he'll keep coming back and so will his fans!







The SOLD OUT concert will take place on Friday, 10/23/09 at the Wachovia Spectrum with three legendary musical acts from Philadelphia, PA! In honor of the prices for the first Spectrum show, tickets reflected the original ticket prices of \$4, \$5 & \$6!

There were also a limited amount of VIP tickets available for \$150 which included: a Certificate for a brick from Spectrum and admission to VIP party after the concert - happening on the floor of the legendary Spectrum and include: Open Bar, Food, and appearances by performers! A VIP After Party with an open bar on the floor of the Spectrum has never been done before and this will only add to the historic send-off to the legendary, historic and beloved Spectrum!

The concert is part of the blast of final shows at the Spectrum and is scheduled right in between 4 concerts by Bruce Springsteen & The E Street Band and 4 concerts by Pearl Jam!

Daryl Hall and John Oates started working together in the early 1970's and went on to become the most successful duo in rock history. Meeting in a freight elevator while escaping a riot at the Aldephi Ballroom during the club's legendary Battle of the Bands, Daryl and John would join forces to become the pioneers of Rock & Soul. With over 60 million albums sold, Philly's own, Daryl Hall & John Oates' rich repertoire has garnered a total of 8 #1 hit singles along with dozens of hits throughout the 70's, 80's, 90's, including 2002's "Do It For Love,". Other top singles include: "Rich Girl," "Kiss On My List," "Maneater," "Private Eyes," "I Can't Go For That (No Can Do), "Sara Smile," "She's Gone," and "One On One,". Their



trademark sound of rock 'n' soul can be heard in the harmonies of today's young pop stars, in the return to radio of sophisticated R & B, even in the black/white demographics of hip-hop and rap-rock fusion. They also took part in Live Aid in 1985.

In 1997, realizing the direction that the music industry was headed, Daryl and John released Marigold Sky on their own label. Taking a break to work on solo projects, the duo would not record and release new material until 2002's critically acclaimed, "Do It for Love". The album's title song went to number 1 on the Billboard and R&R's Adult Contemporary charts and remained there for 4 consecutive weeks. Their latest album, Our Kind Of Soul, featured timeless classics as well as new material that borrowed from their Philadelphia roots. The duo also recorded their first ever Christmas album, "Home For Christmas" in the Fall of 2006.

The Hooters are an American rock band from Philadelphia, PA. By combining a mix of rock and roll, ska and folk music. The Hooters first gained major commercial success in the United States in the mid 1980s due to heavy radio and MTV airplay of several songs including "Day By Day," "And We Danced" and "Where Do The Children Go." Their popularity resulted in the band opening the Philadelphia portion of the Live Aid benefit concert in 1985.

During the 1980s, The Hooters played on the Philadelphia club scene, boosted by airplay on 93.3 WMMR, the major rock radio station in Philadelphia at the time. They soon became a huge success along their native East Coast, playing everything from clubs to high schools, while appearing on local television shows. The original versions of "Man in the Street", "Fightin' on the Same Side", "Rescue Me", and "All You Zombies" were released as singles in this time period.

In 1982, Bazilian and Hyman were asked to write, arrange and play on the debut album of a relatively unknown singer named Cyndi Lauper, "She's So Unusual", who was being produced by their former bandmate from Baby Grand, Rick Chertoff. Hyman co-wrote the song "Time After Time," which would go on to hit Number 1 on the Billboard Hot 100 Singles Chart and was subsequently nominated for a Grammy Award for Song of the Year. On 5/11/04, The Hooters were presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Philadelphia Music Awards.

During the late 1980s and 1990s, The Hooters found significant commercial success internationally, especially in Europe, where they played at The Wall Concert in Berlin in 1990, before they went on hiatus in 1995.

Except for a small reunion heard on the concept album, "Largo" (which featured appearances by all the members except for Lilley) in 1998, The Hooters did not play together again until 11/21/01, when they performed at the Wachovia Spectrum in Philadelphia for a one off show to celebrate disc jockey Pierre Robert's 20th anniversary at local rock radio station 93.3 WMMR, the first major station to ever play The Hooters back in the early 1980s.

Since reuniting in 2001, The Hooters have staged successful tours in Europe and 2007 saw the release of their first album of new material since 1993, "Time Stand Still".

The current line-up of the Hooters consists of: Eric Bazilian, lead vocals, guitars, mandolin, harmonica, saxophone, Rob Hyman, lead vocals, keyboards, accordion, melodica, David Uosikkinen, drums, percussion, John Lilley, guitar, mandolin, dobro, keyboards, vocals and Fran Smith Jr., bass guitar, vocals.



Rundgren was born in Upper Darby, PA. He began his career in Woody's Truck Stop, a Philadelphia-based group based on the model of Paul Butterfield Blues Band. However, he left the band to form the garage rock group, Nazz in 1967. The group gained minor recognition with the songs "Open My Eyes" and "Hello It's Me" (#41 Canada). (He later recorded a solo, uptempo version of "Hello It's Me"; it became a Top Ten hit and remains one of his signature songs (#17 Canada)). Nazz released three albums during this time: "Nazz" in 1968, "Nazz Nazz", in 1969 and "Nazz III", in 1970.

In addition to his own recordings, Rundgren has produced albums for Halfnelson (first incarnation of Sparks), New York Dolls, Badfinger, Grand Funk Railroad, Hall & Oates, Meat Loaf, Patti Smith, Shaun Cassidy, The Tubes, Tom Robinson Band, Bad Religion, Cheap Trick, The Psychedelic Furs, The Band, and many others. Rundgren's production of Meat Loaf's, 'Bat Out Of Hell', helped that album become one of the very top selling LPs released in the 1970s.

Rundgren has long been on the cutting edge of music and video technologies. His music video for the song "Time Heals" was among the first videos aired on MTV. His experience with computer graphics dates back to 1981, when he developed one of the first computer paint programs, dubbed the Utopia Graphics System; it ran on an Apple II with Apple's digitizer tablet. He is also the co-developer of the computer screensaver system Flowfazer.

All that information aside, no matter what name you associate with this once-in-a-lifetime concert, it will without a doubt be incredible!

The Wachovia Center & Wachovia Spectrum Rock October !!! By Michael Davis & Lisa Young

As most of you know by now the Spectrum is going to be demolished. However, before it is, the Spectrum is getting a killer send-off of concerts!

Maxwell plays on 10/3/09, then Bruce Springsteen & The E Street Band play 4 concerts on 10/13/09, 10/14/09, 10/19/09 and 10/20/09. Leonard Cohen plays on 10/22/09, followed by 93.3 WMMR's "Last Call At The Spectrum" concert on 10/23 featuring Philly's own; Hall & Oates, The Hooters and Todd Rundgren. Finally, Pearl Jam will be the last act to ever perform at the spectrum on 10/31/09, finishing off their set of 4 concerts at the building scheduled for 10/27/09, 10/28/09, 10/30/09 and 10/31/09.

In case you were unaware of the vast history of the Spectrum, here is just a little information to let you know how special, beloved and remembered this venue will be for so many.

Construction of the arena occurred at a rapid pace so that the city's first National Hockey League franchise, the Philadelphia Flyers, could compete in the 1967-68 NHL season. Eleven months later, the Spectrum opened house for its first event ever, the Quaker City Jazz Festival. The two-day concert appeared from 9/30/67 to 10/1/67. Ed Snider, the original and current owner of the Flyers said, "This building was just an idea 16 months ago and we got it done in record time." First night patrons fought huge traffic tie-ups going into the parking lots, delaying the jazz festival by fifty-five minutes.

The last of six main acts, which included Ramsey Lewis, Hugh Masakela and comedian Flip Wilson, did not finish until 3 a.m. The second performance drew a full house of 17,500 fans. It was the largest indoor audience in Philadelphia and Pennsylvania history. A 12-day run of Holiday on Ice followed. Boxing was the first sporting event at the young building, featuring a Joe Frazier vs. Tony Doyle card, on Tuesday, 10/17/67.

The next morning, the official dedication of the Spectrum took place under a canopy by the main entrance. The 76ers played their first game at the Spectrum that night, defeating the Los Angeles Lakers, 103-87. The Flyers debuted in their new home on Thursday, 10/19/67 with a 1-0 triumph over Pittsburgh.

It is hard to believe, but 42 years later in 2009, there now are plans to tear this beloved building down, as the Comcast-Spectacor sports complex boasts the Wachovia Center, Lincoln Financial Field and Citizens Bank Park. The "plan" is to tear down the Spectrum to make room for an entertainment complex in an effort to make the entire complex more lucrative and consumer friendly. The project, dubbed "Philly Live!" will include shops, bars and restaurants. The development will be located on the site of a parking lot that currently separates the Spectrum from the Wachovia Center, with preliminary plans showing a hotel where the Spectrum is currently located.

Lincoln Financial Field is the new home to the Philadelphia Eagles, but also has hosted concerts from Bruce Springsteen and Kenny Chesney in 2008. Citizens Bank Park, the new home for the Philadelphia Phillies, just hosted The Police Reunion concert there last year, as well as, Jimmy Buffett.

New homes for the Eagles and Phillies, as Veterans Stadium, which had been home to both teams, from 1971 to 2003, was demolished on 3/21/04. The Spectrum was home to the Flyers and the 76ers from 1967 to 1996. Now the Flyers and 76ers play at the Wachovia Center.

The history of this landmark is staggering! The Spectrum went into operation in 1967, 9/30/67 to be exact, opening with the two-day Quaker City Jazz Festival. On 10/17/67, Joe Frazier boxed against Tony Doyle. The 20th Annual NBA All-Star Game was held on 1/20/70. The Flyers won 2 Stanley Cups in the Spectrum in 1974 and 1975. The Flyers played the Soviet Red Army on 1/11/76. The Spectrum hosted the 29th Annual NHL All-Star Game on 1/20/76 and the 26th Annual NBA All-Star Game on 2/3/76. Luciano Pavarotti sang there on 4/5/76. Elvis Presley sang there on 5/28/77. Bruce Springsteen had 8 sold out concerts there in 1981. The 76ers won the NBA Finals there, sweeping the Lakers in 1983. Frank Sinatra, Liza Minelli and Sammy Davis Jr. had a concert there on 9/27/88. Billy Joel sold out a 6 night



engagement there in January of 1991. Luther Vandross had 3 sold out concerts in October of 1991. The 43rd Annual NHL All-Star Game was played there on 1/18/92. The Grateful Dead played their 50th concert there on 10/7/92. Billy Joel sold out another 6 night set of concerts in September and October of 1993. The Philadelphia Wings (Philly's lacrosse team in the NLL) won their 4th Championship there on 4/8/95. Mike Tyson boxed against Buster Mathis Jr. there on 12/16/95. The Philadelphia Phantoms (Philly's minor league hockey team) won the Calder Cup there on 6/10/98. Bruce Springsteen is scheduled to play the Spectrum on 10/13/09, 14/09, 10/19/09 and 10/20/09! Then Pearl Jam will be the final act playing there on 10/28/09 and 10/30/09! Pearl Jam will in effect be the band that officially says, "Goodbye" to this beloved and historic building.

Since 1967, the Wachovia Spectrum has held thousands of events. From NHL to NBA championships with the Flyers and 76ers, to Dorothy Hamill's first appearance with the Ice Capades and Elvis Presley's last live performance at the Spectrum. The building has hosted just about everything.

So, the Pearl Jam concerts will be the last piece of concert history for our beloved Spectrum! This legendary building, which holds so many fond memories for so many people, will soon be gone, just like Veterans Stadium, JFK Stadium (where Live Aid was held on July 13, 1985) and Connie Mack Stadium.

Many people hoped that the Spectrum would not have the same fate as these other stadiums, but when it does, at least we will always have our memories of all the great events that happened at the Spectrum!

In closing this article, which feels to be somewhat of a eulogy, here a few final words from Comcast-Spectacor chairman Ed Snider. "The Spectrum is my baby, but after a lot of thinking and discussions, we all feel it is in our best interest to close the Spectrum. It's something we've been reluctant to do, but at this point, I think the building has seen its best days, but, we'll have great memories from this building."

Steely Dan has added new dates to the fall North American leg of its "Rent Party 09" tour, which will find the veteran duo performing a pair of its classic albums in full on the road.

The duo kicks off the outing 10/12/09 in Seattle. New dates have been added in November, extending the trek to 19 cities, with the jaunt concluding 11/25/09 & 11/26/09 in Toronto.

Steely Dan will be playing 2 back-to-back concerts at the Tower Theater in Philadelphia, PA on 11/19/09 & 11/20/09!

On the road, the band will continue its "Classic Album (Plus)" format, which will feature Walter Becker and Donald Fagen performing one of the band's albums in its entirety each night, with some shows devoted to fan requests sent via the Internet. The schedule below lists each night's featured content.


On 11/19/09 they will play "Aja" (released in 1977) and on 11/20/09 they will play "The Royal Scam" (released in 1976), both from start to finish, plus a few other of their hits thrown at the end of the concerts!

The fall shows, along with the band's earlier summer trek, mark the fourth consecutive year that the pair has toured after avoiding consistent roadwork for several years. "Everything Must Go," the duo's most recent release, which surfaced in 2003, followed their first studio album in 20 years, 2000's "Two Against Nature." That record not only received double-platinum certification, but also won a Grammy Award for Album of the Year.

Though the pair was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2001 for their work with Steely Dan, they also have successful solo careers.
